Charles Bridge

must see!

Address: Prague 1

One of Prague's most romantic sights, a stroll on Charles Bridge presents fine views of Prague Castle, the Vltava River and many of Prague's famous riverside attractions. Charles Bridge connects the Old Town to the Lesser Town (Mala Strana).

Charles Bridge Museum

Address: Krizovnicke namesti 3, Old Town, Prague 1

The Charles Bridge Museum explores the history of Prague's famous river crossing, explaining the stages of its construction through miniature models, artefacts and replica parts.

Czech Museum of Music

Address: Karmelitska 2, Lesser Town, Prague 1

The Czech Museum of Music is located in the former Baroque church of St. Mary Magdalene. It holds a collection of around 700,000 items, documenting the history of music in the city and the wider world.

Dancing House

Address: Jiraskovo namesti, New Town, Prague 2

Dancing House cuts a fine figure alongside the river, a strikingly modern contrast to the historic Prague attractions. On the top floor of Dancing House is Ginger & Fred, one of Prague's leading restaurants, offering fine French cuisine and magnificent city views.

Estates Theatre

must see!

Address: Ovocny trh 1, Old Town, Prague 1

The Estates Theatre in Prague is one of the finest historical theatres in Europe. Mozart personally conducted the premiere of the opera Don Giovanni here in 1787. The theatre stages a variety of operas throughout the year, many by Mozart.



Funicular Railway

Address: Petrin Hill, Lesser Town, Prague 5

Runs from the Lesser Town up Petrin Hill. At the top, set in landscaped gardens, is Petrin Lookout Tower, a mirror maze & an observatory. A half way stop serves Nebozizek Restaurant.

Golden Lane at Prague Castle

Address: Prague Castle, Castle District, Prague 1

Golden Lane is an ancient street of 11 historic houses within the Prague Castle complex. Inside the houses are displays of armoury, textiles & other attractions, along with tourist souvenir shops.

Heydrich Terror Memorial and St. Cyril & Methodius Church

Address: Resslova 9a, New Town, Prague 1

In May 1942 two Czechoslovak paratroopers assassinated Reinhard Heydrich, the Nazi overseer. A museum in the crypt tells the story.

Infant Jesus of Prague and Church of Our Lady Victorious

Address: Karmelitska 9, Lesser Town, Prague 1

The church houses a statue called the Infant Jesus of Prague. It is credited with miraculous healing and, amongst other things, with saving Prague during the Swedish siege in 1639.

Jewish Museum in Prague

Address: Jewish Quarter (Josefov), Prague 1

The Jewish Quarter contains the best preserved complex of historical Jewish monuments in Europe. The 'Jewish Museum in Prague' is a collection of the most significant of these monuments.

Jewish Quarter (Josefov)

Address: Josefov, Prague 1

The Jewish Quarter in Prague, known as Josefov, is located between the Old Town Square and the river. Its torrid history dates from the 13th century. Entrance fees apply to visit the monuments.

Jindrisska Tower

Address: Jindrisska, New Town, Prague 1

Jindrisska Tower (Jindrisska Vez) is a multi-level attraction, offering fine views over Prague from the top. Jindrisska is the highest separate belfry in Prague at 66m high and has ten floors.

Klementinum

must see!

Address: Karlova 1, Old Town, Prague 1

Founded in 1232, the Klementinum is one of the most historic sights in Prague. Its attractions include the Astronomical Tower, which offers 360° views over the Old Town; the Baroque Library; and the stunning Mirror Chapel, which hosts classical concerts.

Lesser Town

must see!

Address: Prague 1

The Lesser Town (Mala Strana) clusters around the foothills of Prague Castle. This picturesque area of ancient burgher houses, quaint side streets and St. Nicholas Church is a favourite setting for movies and commercials.

Lesser Town Bridge Tower

Address: Charles Bridge, Lesser Town, Prague 1

The Lesser Town Bridge Tower is situated at one end of Charles Bridge. For tourists arriving from the Old Town, this ancient gate is the main pedestrian entrance to the Lesser Town.

Lobkowicz Palace at Prague Castle

Address: Jirska 3, Castle District, Prague 1

Part of the Prague Castle complex, Lobkowicz Palace holds masterpieces by 12th-20th century painters, weapons and ceramics collections, musical instruments, and rare manuscripts from Mozart and Beethoven. It also hosts a popular lunchtime classical concert.

<u>Loreta</u>

Address: Loretanske namesti 7, Castle District, Prague 1

The beautiful Loreta is an important pilgrimage site, built to promote the legend of Santa Casa. The church is situated in a delightful courtyard surrounded by chapel-lined arcades.

Mucha Museum

Address: Panska 7, Kaunicky Palace, New Town, Prague 1

A small museum dedicated to the life and works of the Czech Art Nouveau artist Alphonse Mucha, famous for his poster designs for the theatre productions of the actress Sarah Bernhardt.

Municipal House

must see!

Address: Republic Square 5, Old Town, Prague 1

Municipal House in Prague is one of the finest Art Nouveau buildings in Europe. Inside is a magnificent complex of rooms, including the largest concert hall in Prague, fine restaurants, an American cocktail bar, an elegant traditional café and exhibition rooms.

Museum of Communism

Address: V Celnici 4, New Town, Prague 1

The Museum of Communism is the primary attraction of its kind in Prague, leading visitors through the life of the Czech people in the times of the Soviet Union.

Address: Wenceslas Square 68, New Town, Prague 1

The National Museum is the largest, oldest museum in the Czech Republic. This monumental, neo-Renaissance building, dominates the top of Wenceslas Square and houses a vast array of exhibits.

Address: Narodni 2, New Town, Prague 1

The National Theatre in Prague is a stunning neo-Renaissance building set on the banks of the Vltava River, its golden roof gleaming in the sunshine on fine weather days.

Address: Charles Bridge, Old Town, Prague 1

Part of Prague's old fortification system, the Old Town Bridge Tower is one of the most beautiful Gothic towers in Europe and heralds the entrance to the Old Town from Charles Bridge.

Old Town Hall Tower & Astronomical Clock

Address: Old Town Square, Old Town, Prague 1

The Astronomical Clock is one of the most popular Prague tourist attractions. Watch the procession of the Twelve Apostles, then climb the tower for spectacular views over the Old Town.

Address: Old Town, Prague 1

With its origins in the 12th century, the Old Town Square is the most significant square in the historical centre of Prague and is unquestionably one of the most beautiful historical sights in Europe.

Address: Lesser Town, Prague 5

Take the funicular to the top of Petrin Hill, then climb the Lookout Tower to enjoy the views over Prague. There are also landscaped gardens, a mirror maze and an observatory.

Powder Tower

Address: Republic Square, Old Town, Prague 1

The Powder Tower can trace its origins back to the 11th century, when it was one of 13 entrances to the Old Town. In time it was used to store gunpowder, so became known as the Powder Tower.

Prague State Opera

Address: Wilsonova 4, New Town, Prague 1

Prague State Opera stages a varied programme of opera and ballet by Verdi, Tchaikovsky, Puccini, Rossini, Donizetti, Prokofiev and other composers. The theatre is currently closed for renovation.

Prague Zoo

Address: U Trojskeho zamku 120, Troja, Prague 7

Prague Zoo is the most visited zoological garden in the Czech Republic. There are 5000 animals and 650 species and the grounds stretch from a lush river valley to rolling meadows.

Rudolfinum (Dvorak Hall)

Address: Alsovo nabrezi 12, Old Town, Prague 1

The Rudolfinum is a significant Neo-Renaissance structure set in a commanding position near the river. The Dvořák Hall inside the Rudolfinum hosts a varied programme of classical music concerts, mostly performed by the Czech Philharmonic Orchestra.

Sea World

Address: Vystaviste, Holesovice, Prague 7

The largest Sea World in the Czech Republic boasts a giant fish tank containing 100,000 litres of seawater. Observe an array of fish feeding off coral, along with sharks, moray eels and rays.

Spanish Synagogue

Address: Vezenska 1, Josefov, Prague 1

The Spanish Synagogue in Prague is described as the most beautiful synagogue in Europe. Set in the Jewish Quarter (Josefov), this magnificent building forms part of the Jewish Museum, plus is the wonderful setting for early evening classical concerts.

St. George's Basilica at Prague Castle

Address: Prague Castle, Castle District, Prague 1

St. George's Basilica was founded by Prince Vratislav (915-921) and is both the best-preserved Romanesque church in Prague, and the oldest church building in the Prague Castle complex.

St. George's Basilica is a popular setting for classical concerts.



St. Nicholas Church at Lesser Town Square

Address: Lesser Town Square, Lesser Town, Prague 1

St. Nicholas Church at Malostranske namesti is the largest church in Prague founded by the Jesuits. Began in 1703, it is the masterpiece of Christoph and Kilian Ignaz Dientzenhofer.

Address: Old Town Square, Old Town, Prague 1

The lovely white façade of St. Nicholas Church gleams in the corner of the Old Town Square, hit by the sun during the day and lit by strong white lights at night. Classical concerts are held here.

St. Vitus Cathedral at Prague Castle

must see!

Address: Prague Castle, Castle District, Prague 1

St. Vitus Cathedral is the dominant building within the Prague Castle complex. The cathedral is a Gothic masterpiece commissioned by Charles IV in 1344. Visitors can climb the Great South Tower to enjoy magnificent views over the city.

Strahov Monastery

Address: Strahovske nadvori 1, Strahov, Castle District, Prague 1

Strahov Monastery sits above Petrin Hill, and offers a serene view over the Lesser Town. Take time to contemplate life in this tranquil location, and visit its famous library of over 16,000 books.

Tyn Church

must see!

Address: Old Town Square, Old Town, Prague 1

Tyn Church, founded in 1385, dominates one side of the Old Town Square in Prague. The towers of this powerful looking Gothic church (with a Baroque interior) can be seen from all over Prague.

<u>Villa Amerika Dvorak Museum</u> Address: Ke Karlovu 20, Vinohrady, Prague 2

Villa Amerika in Prague houses the Dvořák Museum, dedicated to the life and works of the great Czech composer. This 18th century summer palace also hosts "living history" classical concerts.

VItava River

Address: Prague

The Vltava River flows through the centre of Prague. It is the waterway around which the city has developed over the past 1000 years. The Lesser Town borders one bank, the Old Town and New Town the other. Spanning the two is Charles Bridge.

Address: V Pevnosti 5b, Vysehrad, Prague 2

Vysehrad Park covers a large area. Visitors can take a pleasant walk through landscaped gardens, enjoy a picnic, admire fine views over the river and visit the Church of St. Peter & Paul.
